If people give them money they will continue to target churches and they are also more likely to become more demanding, and dependent on begging as additional source of income to what the government is already providing them.

**Clapping in Church**

A Catholic church is the house of God. Christ truly dwells in the Tabernacle. He should be the focus of our attention. The church is also the place where the Sacrifice of Calvary becomes present on our altars. At every Mass we are enabled to participate in offering the crucified Jesus to Our Heavenly Father and to receive the graces that flow from this Sacrifice. Clapping at Mass diminishes the sacred character of the Mass and of the physical church, turning it into a place of entertainment. The singing at Mass is intended to raise our hearts to the Lord and to praise Him; not the singers or musicians. They once asked St. Padre Pio what was the problem with clapping at Mass. He answered, “In Calvary there were those who were applauding Christ's death: soldiers and demons.”
