**14. What is the new commandment of love in the New Testament?**

The Golden Rule ("Treat others as you would have them treat you") is recognized in many cultures as a norm of the good life. The commandment of love in the Old Testament is even more forceful: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Lev 19:18). Jesus intensifies the commandment of mutual love and makes it more specific by attaching it to himself and the sacrifice of his life: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12). This love is oriented toward community and the individual in equal measure: everyone matters, as a unique, unrepeatable person loved by God - and through love everyone relies on others. Divine love is the beginning of a "civilization of love" (Popes Paul VI and John Paul II), to which all human beings can contribute.

**15. Is man called to love?**

Yes, it is profoundly in keeping with human nature to be loved and to offer love. In this, God himself serves as our ideal. Jesus showed us that the very being of God is love. Between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, an eternal exchange of love takes place. A loving human being, too, has a share in this communion of love. Our life can succeed only if we do not shut ourselves off from the stream of divine love but rather open our hearts to it. Love causes us to be open to the needs of our neighbor and makes us capable of going beyond ourselves. Jesus Christ, who out of love for mankind freely sacrificed himself on the Cross, accomplished the greatest deed of love precisely by going beyond his own human life.

**PLENARY INDULGENCES FOR THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA**

In honour of the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, the faithful may receive a plenary indulgence throughout the anniversary year, which ends November 26, 2017.

To obtain the plenary indulgence, the faithful must fulfill the ordinary conditions of an indulgence; make a pilgrimage to the Fatima shrine in Portugal or pray before a statue of Our Lady of Fatima anywhere in the world; and pray an Our Father, recite the Creed and invoke Our Lady of Fatima. The elderly and infirm who are unable to otherwise participate in the indulgence conditions may receive the indulgence if they pray in front of a statue of Our Lady of Fatima while offering prayers, sufferings or sacrifices and spiritually uniting themselves to the jubilee celebrations on the days of the apparitions.
